



This FAQ has been developed in conjunction with Frankston & District Basketball Association's (FDBA) 'COVID-19 Return to Play Plan'. FDBA's return to play plan is guided by directives endorsed by the Victorian Government and Basketball Victoria, basketball's peak governing body in the state.

Question 1: Is casual shooting permitted to commence?

Answer: FDBA will be open for casual shooting providing the following protocols are met:

- Bookings essential
- All participants are required to use the dedicated entry/exit points
- All participants are required to sign in at the stadium
- Each participant is required to sanitise their hands using hand sanitiser provided
 - Sanitisation equipment is provided at each court for this purpose
- One casual shooting session per hour
 - All six courts can be used
- Over 18 participants are limited to six people per ring, subject to 1.5m distancing requirements
- 18 and under participants are permitted to train/play with full-contact and with 12 people allowed per court
- A 20-minute changeover between casual shooting sessions will be utilised to ensure FDBA's Biosafety Officer can follow the cleaning and sanitising protocol

Question 2: Are spectators permitted to watch trainings and competitions when resumed?

Answer: One spectator per player is allowed under Basketball Victoria's Return to Sport guidelines. These spectators must adhere to social distancing requirements of 1.5m set by the Victorian Chief Health Officer.

Question 3: Do team official roles such as a coach/team manager/scorer count towards the one spectator per participant limit?

Answer: Coaches/team managers/scorers do not count towards the spectator limit. For example, a team manager would not count towards the spectator limit, so they would be able to have another person (i.e. sibling to the child participating) attend the match as a spectator. Question 4: How much is entry, and can I pay by cash?

Answer: Casual shooting entry costs \$4.00 per player. FDBA is moving towards a cashless system so only EFTPOS payments will be accepted. This is another precaution aimed at stopping the spread of COVID-19.

Question 5: Can teams book courts for training during the term 2 school holidays?

Answer: Please see the categories below for court bookings:

Junior Team Training Bookings (18 and Under)

- Full court bookings only
- \$20.00 Hire Fee per team
- Max 12 Players
- Max 1 spectator per player
- Max 3 team staff (coaches/team manager)
- All participants required to sign in upon arrival
- Max 40 minutes per session

Junior Casual Shooting Bookings

- 2 - 6 participants = half court booking
- Strictly non-contact training
- \$4.00 Fee per person
- Max 6 Players Per Half Court
- Max 1 session per week
- All participants required to sign in upon arrival
- Max 40 minutes per session

Adult Bookings (Over 18)

- 2 - 6 participants = half court booking
- 7 - 12 participants = full court booking
- Strictly non-contact training
- \$4.00 Fee per person
- Max 12 Players Per Court
- Max 1 session per week
- All participants required to sign in upon arrival
- Max 40 minutes per session

Question 6: Will the canteen be open?

Answer: FDBA's canteen will be closed until further notice. It is recommended all participants bring their own drink bottle.

Question 7: What is FDBA's protocols surrounding a potential COVID-19 case?

Answer: FDBA will implement the following protocols to check if participants are free of coronavirus (COVID-19) symptoms:

- Visual risk assessment of symptoms by nominated Biosafety Officers
- Biosafety Officers required to complete DHHS endorsed Infection Control Training
- FDBA will implement the following protocols for people who present to training or competition with symptoms consistent with coronavirus (COVID-19) (fever or respiratory symptoms such as cough, sore throat, and shortness of breath):
 - If a participant shows symptoms of COVID-19 the department of health COVID-19 public hotline will be notified and advice from health officials will be followed
 - The participant will be isolated, and others advised to maintain social distancing measures
 - Seek advice from the person and assess the risks

- Clean and disinfect all operational areas
